**The ASID Foundation Strengthens Support of CIDA**

The ASID Foundation is proud to continue its support of the Council for Interior Design Accreditation (CIDA) by providing a grant to help fund its Collaborative Strategies session. The fall 2010 initiative will bring together interior design and related disciplines to identify factors influencing collaboration in practice and how future practitioners might commonly be required to address these. CIDA will use this information toward the continued development of professional standards for interior design education. Results of the session also will be made available for the benefit of the professional community as a whole.

CIDA-accredited interior design programs report that

standards for education are by far the most influential factor in curriculum development. This fact emphasizes the need for standards to keep pace with changes in practice. “The interdisciplinary nature of the profession and the need to collaborate effectively across disciplines is a clear and consistent message from practice. Clients more than ever expect a wide range of expertise, and the next generation of designers are innate collaborators and multi-taskers, having grown up with technology and social networking. CIDA directors believe these factors have significant implications for both design practice and education,” noted Robert Wright, FASID, chair of the CIDA Board. “We are grateful that the ASID Foundation Trustees see the value in engaging our allied disciplines in this important discussion.”

In 2008, ASID Foundation also issued a grant to support CIDA’s project to examine the accreditation process and to develop support services for programs seeking accreditation. The overall goal of the project was to introduce improvements to accreditation services and support a seamless transition to the new accreditation standards in 2009.

## Expanding Interior Design Education for Youth

This past year the ASID Foundation has partnered with the Interior Design Educators Council (IDEC), the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences (AAFCS) and a consortium of 30 states to develop a national interior design examination, known as the Pre-Professional Certification for Interior Design Fundamentals” for high school students and/or entry-level junior college students. The pilot study took place Spring 2010 and the examination will become available this fall. Upon successful completion of the exam, students may receive credit toward an associate

or bachelor degree in interior design and/or earn a credential to enhance employment potential upon graduation.

### Benefits to students

- \* Career starter program for high school students
- \* Certificate recognition of extra academic efforts
- \* Accurate information about career prior to post-secondary education

### Benefits to practitioners/educators

- \* Educates future interior design educators, practitioners and students
- \* Removes myths perpetuated through design reality shows

ASID members are invited to connect with the high school teachers in their community that offer interior design courses. Teachers would love both college students and professionals to assist them in communicating the most accurate and up-to-date information about the profession of interior design.

The Development Board selected to create the examination includes representation from interior design practice as well as high school, community college and higher education. ## Increasing REGREEN Awareness

In June, Thom Banks, deputy executive director of ASID, and Jennifer Owens from USGBC



manned a REGREEN booth at the Dwell on Design show at the Los Angeles Convention Center. The show attracts an audience of about 15,000 people presenting a mix of building professionals and consumers, most of whom are predisposed toward a sustainable design message.

The booth, its display of case studies and our take-away literature prompted many substantive conversations and positive reactions but underscored the need for heightened awareness of the program...the most common question regarding REGREEN being, "What is it?" We hopefully answered that question for many of Dwell attendees as in addition to the booth; there were three separate 30-minute presentations from the "sustainability stage" on the trade show floor that heavily referenced the REGREEN program over the course of the show.

REGREEN continues to struggle to gain traction on the 300 level workshops and has had to cancel many due to lack of registrants. ASID and USBGC have engaged our respective marketing teams to retrench perhaps focusing on a regional approach and building outward. We continue to expand content on the site (eight of 12 additional case studies slated for this year are now up on the site) and we'll continue to make site improvements in response to user feedback.
